

Our Approach:

From the very first phone call, our bilingual, bicultural team is with your family every step of the way, from assessment to treatment to healing.

With the Latina Girls Project, the Guidance Center employs weekly sessions of individual, group and family therapy, along with monthly outings and other activities, all designed to tackle issues such as depression, low selfesteem, social anxiety, cultural assimilation, school refusal, self-harming behaviors or suicidal ideation.

Family therapy sessions are offered entirely in Spanish, helping to foster communication, ease conflict, and overcome language barriers.

Graduates of the program are given the opportunity to become Program Ambassadors, serving as supportive mentors for other Latina Girls and helping them navigate their own journeys.

Unlike many providers, the Guidance Center promises that at-risk children and teens will be seen within 24-48 hours, when the case is deemed urgent.

The Problem:

Our team at the Guidance Center noticed an increasingly large number of first-generation Latinas coming to us with severe depression, self-harming behaviors and suicidal thoughts. Many had stopped attending school, and some had been hospitalized for suicide attempts.

When a crisis arises, parents often struggle to find timely and professional help. With the Latina Girls Project, the Guidance Center provides a family centered, culturally informed solution to bring hope and healing to those who need it most.



The Statistics:

- •1 in 4 Latina girls have considered attempting suicide.
- •47% of Latina girls feel sad and hopeless on a daily basis.
- 3 in 4 Latina girls report experiencing at least one sign of poor or decreased mental health in the past 30 days.
- Suicide attempts for Latina girls, grades 9-12, are 30% higher than for white females of the same age group.
- Only 31% of Latina girls experiencing depression received mental health treatment.



Monthly Outings:

Supervised trips are designed to boost the teens' confidence and sense of independence, allowing the girls to discover a world of opportunity. By introducing the teens to diverse experiences, we help them envision a brighter future, giving hope and a sense of possibility to those who often struggle to get through the day.
